Message from Pastor Bob

"If any of you is lacking in wisdom, ask God, who gives to all generously and ungrudgingly, and it will be given you." (James 1:5, NRSV)

True confession: while driving, I like to know where I am, where I am going, and what I can expect to encounter along the way. This is admittedly not so difficult to achieve when driving on familiar roads. But when in a place that is completely unfamiliar, this becomes a bit more challenging. Fortunately, map apps on today's smart phones are pretty good. But go back 20 years, and one is left with a paper map and a navigator in the passenger's seat. And when that *navigator* in the passenger seat is one's spouse ... well, let's just say that its ability to test a couple's compatibility rivals that of wall-papering a bathroom together.

But on a more serious note, this really touches on the topic of reliable source material. Where does one go where one can truly trust the knowledge and guidance one seeks. Knowing what highway and exit to take in order to get to a particular destination is stressful enough. But the stress of choosing how to live one's life, how to spend one's time, where to invest one's energies, which pathways to follow and which to avoid, can make the stress of driving seem like child's play. Having wisdom we can count on and lean against, becomes much more paramount when it involves something that is rightfully deeply important to us. And when stressed, such wisdom is more important than ever.

So, where does one go to acquire such wisdom? Where does one go to dissipate the stress of particularly difficult situations or important decisions? Where can we go where we can fully trust in the guidance we truly seek? The above focus text from James 1:5 clearly tells us the correct answer. The ONLY infallible and completely trustworthy source of wisdom and guidance is God. God does not possess ulterior motives. God cannot be misguided by incomplete information. God wants what we truly want—that is, that which is in our best interest—and God uniquely can get it to us.



There is only one place that can deliver ... or should I say one person. When under stress, when unclear about what direction to go, when needing to acquire what we lack, we go to God in prayer. Make such prayer the very first go-to ... always ... and for *every* need or desire. Asking God, first, will lead to peace, confidence, answers, and joy.

I'm still going to use my phone navigation app to help me navigate the road system. But I choose God as my first go-to for navigating life. May it be so for you.



Did you know?

..you can donate your IRA assets to the church. IRS rules mandate that individuals aged 72 1/2 and older take a required minimum distribution from their IRA each year. (This doesn't apply to Roth IRA's which has tax-free withdrawals and no required distributions.) You are allowed to make charitable contributions from your traditional IRA to a church or charity at age 70 1/2. You can transfer up to \$100,000 per year from your traditional IRA to the Church or Charity. You can enjoy the satisfaction of knowing that you are contributing to a worthy cause while effectively lowering your tax bill.

VOLUNTERS NEEDED -Counting Ministry

The Counting Ministry counts all monies received by PFUMC and prepares a weekly bank deposit. Counting is done after the weekly Sunday service (time involved is about 30 minutes). Our regular teams are on a rotating 6 week schedule or about 8 times per year.

Since COVID appeared, we have transitioned from 4 person to the minimum of 2 person teams and moved to a single count. Our group has shrunk from 34 to 16.

Substitutes serve based on their availability when needed due to sickness, travel, personal conflicts of regular team members.

The Ministry is in need of volunteers so our reserve of substitutes increases (which is down to FOUR - was 10 before COVID).
