Message from Pastor Bob

"And God is able to bless you abundantly, so that in all things at all times, having all that you need, you will abound in every good work."

(2 Corinthians 9:8, NIV)

As we enter into a new calendar year, I find myself reflecting on the relatively recent past, and pondering upon what lies ahead in this new year of 2023 (I suspect you are doing or have done the same). The last two years have been anything but a walk-in-the-park for me, as the saying goes (I suspect you might be tempted to say the same here as well). And there are lots of reasons any one of us may feel this way ... some unique to our individual experience, and some more common to the overall human experience.

But interestingly, I have discovered that I am quite encouraged for the overall future that lies ahead for us in 2023. This is not to say that I don't think there will be substantial challenges and possible hardship that may come our way ... I expect there will be. But I genuinely believe that the opportunities and positive movement that we will experience will outshine the negative experiences.

Here is why I am genuinely encouraged for our future in 2023:

- Our new Digital Campus initiative already has 70 followers, even though it only soft-launched in mid-December, our formal launch is planned for early February
- We already have a couple Fresh Expressions groups in the early stages of forming
- We continue to see growth in worship attendance, including new faces of all ages
- We are formally re-booting Sunday morning children's programing, including Confirmation
- We are adding to our community partnership activities
- The offering of time, talents, and resources continues to be strong
- We have strong, Christ-loving, God-motivated Lay Leadership

But most of all, the biggest reason I am encouraged about our future in 2023 is that God continues to demonstrate over and over again how God answers prayer, illuminates the path to follow, enables and equips us for success, and is *always* present. On this, I have absolutely no doubt, and it strengthens my encouragement more and more with each passing day. For God continues to demonstrate that the prophet Isaiah's words are indeed true: "do not fear, for I am with you, do not be afraid, for I am your God; I will strengthen you, I will help you, I will uphold you with my victorious right hand." (Isa 41:10, NRSV)

Will there be difficult times or painful experiences along the way during 2023? I think one could safely assume such times and experiences will cross our paths from time to time. But do I believe such times and experiences will overwhelm our focus on God's will and God's provision of blessings and strength? Absolutely not! I am absolutely encouraged about what lies ahead for us as a local church of the Body of Christ in 2023, and I hope you join me in such encouragement.

And so my friends of Plymouth First Church, may our God, who is more than able, bless you abundantly, so that in all times and in all circumstances, having all you need, you will continue to abound in every good work, manifesting the living presence of Christ in our world, being empowered by the Holy Spirit ... Friends –

I am excited for what 2023 has to offer for the people of Plymouth and the members of Plymouth First UMC. We are at an exciting crossroads, co-creating with God a new life of ministry and mission. We have had a couple years of self-examination to assess the parts of our story that have been faithful and productive to God's Kingdom and to let go of some things we love that were not productive. We have grieved some losses and celebrated some triumphs. And now we get to dream God-sized dreams.

Our Christian faith teaches us that God is always at work in the world, redeeming and loving and creating. This year we will explore the ways God has always been at work in the world, and discover how we can identify the ways God is at work today in our community and in our lives. We will be journeying together, as a church, through the Bible in 2023. The Bible is the Spirit-inspired accounting of the ways God has been at work in the world and with people since Creation. We will read from Genesis to Revelation over the course of the next 12 months. Each of these has life-changing potential.

One thing I know about that kind of life-transformation is that it compels us to live differently in the world. Transformation within our hearts is always visible in our words and in our actions. It's undeniable in our relationships with each other, with Creation and with

God. Imagine what Plymouth First can do in 2023 and 2024 and beyond, if we all step forward and allow ourselves to be molded by the beauty of the scripture, if we allow ourselves to be caught up in the greatest story of all time. Let's dream a God-sized dream. And let's commit to doing the work of bringing that dream forth.



Did you know?

...you can donate your IRA assets to the church.

IRS rules mandate that individuals aged 72 1/2 and older take a required minimum distribution from their IRA each year. (This doesn't apply to Roth IRA's which has tax-free withdrawals and no required distributions.) You are allowed to make charitable contributions from your traditional IRA to a church or charity at age 70 1/2. You can transfer up to \$100,000 per year from your traditional IRA to the Church or Charity. You can enjoy the satisfaction of knowing that you are contributing to a worthy cause while effectively lowering your tax bill.

Ask your IRA administrator or tax consultant what steps you need to take.
