Message from Pastor Bob

"Therefore if you have any encouragement from being united with Christ, if any comfort from his love, if any common sharing in the Spirit, if any tenderness and compassion, then make my joy complete by being like-minded, having the same love, being one in spirit and of one mind." (Philippians 2:1-2, NIV)

This may come as no surprise, but I cannot get enough of science documentaries, especially around the creation of the universe, our solar system, our planet, and the natural world in which we live. I love learning about our ever-evolving understanding of the science behind God's amazing and loving Creation of everything. And I am so appreciative that God continues to give us glimpses into how God goes about doing what God does. One part that continues to amaze me is the elegance and overwhelming effectiveness of clouds. What I mean is, for all their beauty, for all their range of motion and activity, what they are more than anything, is God's incredible distribution system for moving the life-critical substance of water around the earth. No clouds ... no rain. No rain ... no water inland of the oceans. No water ... ultimately no life. But God created a water distribution system that, thankfully, functions whether we are smart enough to turn it on or not. And then, God has blessed some of us with the creativity and knowhow to facilitate final steps of distributing that water to where it is needed. Of course, we are still working on completely fulfilling humanity's part of that final distribution step, but we are making progress.

But getting back to clouds, I believe they offer insight into some of God's guiding principles. I believe one of God's major strategies is to create and employ distribution channels to distribute a great deal of God's life-giving blessings around the world and to all that lives in God's Creation, and that humanity holds a special role in that distribution process. God has blessed humanity with the ability to learn, reason, create, and implement. But most of all, God has blessed humanity with an ability to be both uniquely aware and connected to the very presence *of* God. How cool is that?! Now, this certainly applies to the distribution of important materials for life, i.e., water, food, shelter, safety, and things alike. But perhaps even more to the blessings of love, grace, for-giveness, friendship, and the presence of God. In other words, I believe we as humanity have been particularly blessed by God. And as believers in God-in-Christ, we have been blessed, to be a blessing to others, especially as it relates to the blessing of awareness and connection to the presence of God.

But how can we live into that role of being God's distribution system of God's blessings, especially as it relates to ultimately opening up awareness and connection to the presence of God? Turns out, we can do this, by simply sharing the blessings we have already been given, and in everyday easily accessible ways we already know how to do. Which, is exactly what our September sermon series is really all about. Specifically, it is 5 ways that we all can do to connect with God and community, i.e., ways to love our neighbor and change the world. Ways that have direct implication upon family, friendships, and the Church. I look forward to walking through these next 5 weeks together, and experiencing together blessings we will receive, and the blessings we will be.

May you have keen awareness of God's blessing in your life, and in the life of those you love.

Recently you have heard the words "Fresh Expression" talked about during conversations and last week during the worship services. We are starting the discussion for this ministry as it is another piece of what I am bringing to PFUMC. On Saturday, September 17^{th,} we have Rev. Rachel Gilmore coming to PFUMC for a hands-on experience on how we can start Fresh Expressions here in our community.

So what are Fresh Expressions? Here are a few insights by Ministry Matters:

By simply hearing the name "Fresh Expressions," some might think it is a laundry detergent and still others a breath freshener.

Some who hear about Fresh Expressions as a movement might interpret it as a last-ditch effort to "save the institutional church." But Fresh Expressions isn't another new program but a movement of the Holy Spirit.

Fresh Expressions has a particular purpose for a church or community of faith. Here is the working definition from the Fresh Expressions UK website: "A fresh expression is a form of Church for our changing culture, established primarily for the benefit of people who are not yet members of any church. It will come into being through principles of listening, service, contextual mission, and making disciples. It will potentially become a mature expression of Church shaped by the gospel and the enduring marks of the Church and for its cultural context."

Did you know that John Wesley and the early Methodists realized the Church of their day wasn't connecting with most people?

So they went to the fields and found a way to be Church with people who didn't attend Church. That movement jumped across the pond to a fledgling nation that became the United States, and as they say, the rest is history.



What did you discover? What stories moved you the most?


Did you struggle keeping up or was it a breeze to stick to the plan?


